

Maintenance guideline

General maintenance

To keep your slabs looking beautiful, simply scrub them regularly with a simple brush and clean (warm) water. Avoid using acid-based products, and preferably do not clean with high pressure, as this can roughen the surface, making it prone to quicker soiling.

If you do use a high-pressure cleaner, consider the following:

- Clean the slabs beforehand with a brush to prevent coarse dirt from damaging the slabs during the use of the high-pressure cleaner.
- Test on a small area first and let it dry to assess the results.
- Do not set the pressure too high.
- Keep the nozzle of the high-pressure cleaner sufficiently angled relative to the surface and maintain a minimum distance of 20 cm.

Stubborn stains

For stubborn stains such as rust spots, cement residue, oil stains, or other hard-to-remove marks, use a cleaner specifically designed for this purpose (available at building materials suppliers or DIY stores). These cleaning agents are often aggressive and can damage the tile surface if used carelessly. Therefore, take a few precautions:

- Start with a diluted solution (1/10) and perform a local test.
- If this is sufficient, continue with it. Otherwise, increase the concentration incrementally until the stain disappears.
- Rinse the treatment area repeatedly with clean water.
- Cover any plants in the vicinity of the area being treated.
- Wear protective clothing (gloves, goggles, etc.).
- Keep children and pets away from the area.

The sooner you take action after a stain has appeared, the better the result will be.

For all cleaning solutions for the slabs, it's important to always test the products on a single tile (preferably out of sight) to assess the effect.
